A Suggested Order of Nurture for an **Every-Week Circle** of Christian Resurgence

Light Three Candles while singing a verse of a song

Owning Up to Reality

Five Minutes of Silence

Sing

Spirit-Question Go-Round

Absolution

Opening the Mouth of the Infinite Silence

Translate into contemporary metaphors a portion of the Bible and respond to some grounding questions.

Dedicating to Spirit Action on Planet Earth

Study appropriate selections of current ethical thought.

Intercessory Prayers.

Extinguish the Candles while singing a verse of song

Do appropriate business and catching up with each other following rather than preceding the order of nurture.

Suggestions for the Biblical Dialogue

Read from the Gospel of Mark followed by the paragraphs of commentary in The Metaphorical Translation of Mark.

Ask the grounding questions in the Mark commentary.

Read a Psalm or part of a Psalm doing an appropriate metaphorical translation. (Use Speaking Back to the Infinite Silence as a Guide.)

Ask grounding questions.

Read a selection from the Gospel of John as translated in the study book
The Infinite Silence Walks Among Us.
Ask grounding questions.

Do something similar with the stories of Genesis or the letters of Paul

Reconnecting with Scripture is essential, but instead of direct contact with Scripture, a group might

Read short, key passages from Contemporary Christian Theologians and lead a life-grounding discussion.

Select a topic or paper from the CR-21 Course Dynamics and lead a life-grounding discussion.

Select essays or chapters from the theological resources of Realistic Living Press and lead a life-grounding discussion.

Suggestions for the Study of Ethical Thought

We are recommending that we start with Thomas Berry's book *The Great Work* using the twelve-week study outline.

Other appropriate books are listed in the bibliography published on the RealisticLiving.org web site.

Here is another suggestion that might work for ethical reflection:

Read one of the 12 Master Social Strategies paragraphs. and ask these three questions:

What news have we heard on this topic?

How are our current actions carrying out this strategy?

How does this master strategy challenge us to deepen our action?

Silence - Context: The stillness of our body helps us to come to a stillness of mind which enlarges into the stillness of the spirit. A true love of ourselves and others arises out of the experience of stillness. (Sit for 3-5 minutes.)

Absolution: The difficult decisions we face are our good life.

The first step to learn to live in the present moment is by keeping the mind on a present reality. The breath is an ever-present reality of this moment. (Sit for 3-5 minutes.)

Absolution: We always live in wonder.

Silence - Context: Mindfulness makes possible the growth of wisdom and compassion. Mindfulness moves us toward the state of sanity and away from madness. Mindfulness moves us toward non-clinging -- a mind unaffected by the ups and downs of life. (Sit for 3-5 minutes.)

Spirit-Question Go-Round: What "way" is your life creating? Is it the "way" you want for the future?

Absolution: Our past is approved. Our future is open. These two teachings are connected. Trying to justify our past restricts our opening to the future. When we can say "goodbye" to the past, we can also say "hello" to the future.

Silence - Context: Be with the breathing. You will notice that you drift away. Gently come back. You may have to come back a thousand times in five minutes. It's not a problem. Each instance of seeing you've been away is, after all, a moment of mindfulness. (Sit for 3-5 minutes.)

Spirit-Question Go-Round: How are you seeing your life more clearly these days?

Absolution: However clearly we see, we still see dimly. It is proper for our vision to be finite. We are finite creatures and finite creatures are accepted.

Silence - Context: Being mindful of this moment with: nonjudgmental watchfulness, non-conceptual awareness, bare attention, non-egotistic alertness--watching the universe within, noticing what comes up without getting involved. (Sit for 3-5 minutes.)

Spirit-Question Go-Round: What do you sense is your next step on your spirit path?

Absolution: "The future is open" is not an idea to be simply held in the head. It is an action, an actual trusting leap into the unknown future.
